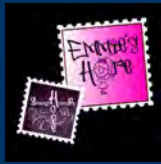


Limited Number of Tables Left for May 13 Annual Celebration

Regional Efforts Assist Haiti Recovery

Many local organizations are responding to the recent crises in Haiti. One example is [Faith Church in Fort Collins](#), which will have a team working in Haiti from March 10-16, providing direct care and programming for more than 300 children through the Global Orphan Project.

Another local agency involved in Haiti relief efforts is [Trees, Water & People](#). The organization established a Haiti Emergency Relief Fund and raised more than \$25,000 that was wired directly to its local partner, AMURT (Ananda Marga Universal Relief Team) to provide immediate water, food, and medical supplies. TWP is currently raising funds to provide Rocket Stoves to Internally Displaced Persons camp.

Our staff has been in close contact with [Erin Mounsey](#), Executive Director of the [American Red Cross Northern Colorado Chapter](#). Donation processing time will be decreased by at least three days if donations are sent to the national Red Cross office rather than to the local office. However, the local office still receives "credit" for the donations, as gifts made to the national office are tracked by zip code of the donor.

In addition, a new law now makes it easier to give. Taxpayers may receive the tax benefit from donations made to the Haiti effort in this tax season, rather than waiting until they file their 2010 tax returns next year. [Read on...](#)
