Rialto Bridge Project Fosters Energy, Builds Partnerships

The Rialto Bridge is a 20,000 square-foot public-private project located in the heart of downtown Loveland that will add density and energy to the area by replacing two existing single-story buildings with a new three-story building. The project has the potential to address the Rialto's needs for the next 50 years by enhancing the community's successful historic performing arts center. It is an opportunity to shape the arts impact in our region and conveys the message that city government, private investors and community philanthropy organizations can work together to enrich our region.

This project will also be a catalyst for downtown revitalization, which is the primary goal of the Community Foundation's [Loveland Community Fund Committee](#). Contingent upon project approval by the City of Loveland, a charitable fund will be created at the Community Foundation to serve as a receptacle for gifts made in support of the \$700,000 capital campaign project. The Loveland Community Fund Committee will provide campaign leadership and has committed to \$100,000 in support to jump start the campaign. 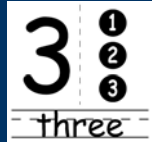


Foundation Interns Take Next Step

Ideas for Giving: Local Programs, Local Impact

The Community Foundation stays in close communication with charitable agencies in our region to strategically connect donors with the causes they care about most. **Here are three giving opportunities that have recently come to our attention:**

- **Crossroads Safehouse Capital Campaign:** In 2009 Crossroads Safehouse sheltered an average of 41 victims of domestic violence and their children per night, yet turned away 138 crisis callers due to lack of space. Crossroads hopes that by early 2011 it will no longer have to turn away families who are in imminent danger. Plans call for a new safehouse to open in early 2011. This will be the first "green" safehouse and the first safehouse in the United States that will have a statewide reach via a dedicated travel vehicle. This will open the doors of the facility to battered women and children from around the state who cannot access safe shelter where they live. - **Smiles Without Borders:** The mission of this 501c3 is to empower national dentists to provide sustained dental care for children in the primary schools in their countries. The organization assists the communities by providing the necessary portable dental equipment and supplies; the local universities and the state governments provide the national dentists who staff the clinics during the school year.
